If you or your child (9 years of age or older) have facial acne, you may be interested in a new clinical research study. The study is for an investigational topical gel, applied once daily, for mild to severe facial acne.

Selected Eligibility Criteria

- ✓ Age 9 or older (minors require parent or legal guardian approval)
- ✓ Have moderate to severe facial acne:
 - Between 30 100 inflamed acne lesions (small red bumps, pimples) on the face
 - Between 35 150 non-inflamed acne lesions (blackheads, whiteheads) on the face
- Are able to attend regular visits at your study doctor's office over a 4 month period

Do you or your child struggle with facial acne?

While nearly everyone struggles with acne when they are young, it's not uncommon to fight acne outbreaks well into our 20's and 30's. Acne can consist of red bumps or pimples, as well as whiteheads and blackheads. Although there are many treatment options available, they do not work for everyone. This is why doctors and researchers continue to study new options that may better treat acne in the future.

Right now, dermatologists at select centers in the U.S. and Canada are accepting participants for a new clinical research study. The study is for an investigational topical gel applied once daily for moderate to severe facial acne. If you or your child (9 years of age or older) struggle with facial acne, you may qualify to participate.

If you qualify and choose to join the study, you or your child will be seen by a local physician and will receive study-related care and medication at no cost. As a study participant, you will be asked to visit your local study center up to 6 times over a 4-month period. These visits allow your study doctor to closely monitor your acne, or that of your child, as well as discuss your overall experiences. You may also be compensated for your time and travel to attend these visits.
